Thank you for hearing out my idea this afternoon. I hope you say YES.

Of course — again I know it is a personal decision and I will honor and support whatever you choose. Truly.

I really appreciate that you agreed to get the new Chief on board and through a transition. Now I hope you'll give serious thought to staying and putting your talent and passion for our city to work in a new role.

Since you told me last week you had changed your mind and felt it was best to move out of the department, I have been thinking through options. I would love for you to consider staying on as Deputy Mayor for Public Safety and Public Health or as Public Safety Advisor (like I said the title is totally negotiable.)

Our City and our first responders are facing new public safety and public health challenges, and I wanted someone in the Mayor's office who can bring a strong and broad public safety perspective into our daily decision making. In recent months, I've been in discussions with my team on the need and importance of filling this critical role. But other than Kathy (and now you) no one has seemed right for it.

You would be great in the role.

Broadly, I see this position as providing policy and operational support over all public safety and related public health issues. We would discuss specifics, of course.
